Indoor Growing

SPACE

Small to moderate - windowsills, shelves, or a spare room with grow lights.

STARTUP COST

Low to moderate - about \$50-\$500+ for lights, pots, soil, and fans.

BEST USE

Herbs, leafy greens, houseplants, and year-round small-scale growing.

CARE LEVEL

Low to moderate - monitor light, watering, airflow, and humidity.

QUICK FIT

Best beginner-friendly year-round option.

Hydroponics

SPACE

Compact - vertical systems can produce more in a small footprint without soil.

STARTUP COST

Low to high - about \$40-\$500+ from countertop kits to multi-tier systems.

BEST USE

Fast-growing greens, herbs, strawberries, and compact tomato varieties.

CARE LEVEL

High - monitor pH, nutrients, water temperature, and equipment.

QUICK FIT

Best for maximum yield in limited space.

Outdoor Garden

SPACE

Largest footprint - depends on yard or plot size, sunlight, and soil conditions.

STARTUP COST

Usually lowest - about \$20-\$200 for tools, seeds, and soil amendments.

BEST USE

Traditional vegetables, fruit trees, large crops, flowers, and pollinator plants.

CARE LEVEL

Moderate - weather, pests, weeds, watering, and seasonal timing matter.

QUICK FIT

Cheapest and simplest traditional starting point.

Greenhouse

SPACE

Moderate to large - requires a dedicated attached, portable, or freestanding structure.

STARTUP COST

Low to high - about \$60-\$5,000+ depending on size and permanence.

BEST USE

Season extension, seed starting, delicate plants, and controlled growing.

CARE LEVEL

Moderate to high - manage temperature, humidity, shade, and ventilation.

QUICK FIT

Best for extending the season and controlling conditions.



Which Growing Method Fits You?

Use these quick decisions to choose the method that best matches your space, budget, and routine.

Start with your biggest limitation

VERY LITTLE SPACE

Hydroponics or indoor growing

Both can work on shelves, counters, or vertical racks.

SMALLEST BUDGET

Outdoor garden

Seeds, basic tools, and soil amendments usually cost the least.

YEAR-ROUND HARVESTS

Indoor growing or hydroponics

Artificial light and indoor temperatures reduce seasonal limits.

MAXIMUM CLIMATE CONTROL

Greenhouse or hydroponics

Both allow tighter control over growing conditions.

LOWEST LEARNING CURVE

Indoor growing or outdoor garden

These methods are easier to understand before adding technical systems.

SEASON EXTENSION

Greenhouse

A greenhouse protects seedlings and extends spring and fall production.
